## **Centre Updates**

The year has been going well. We are still dealing with the Covid-19 pandemic and as we write, Zimbabwe has just announced the fourth wave. With losses of jobs and the after effects of the pandemic, we have seen increased activities at the drop in

centre with more children coming through seeking assistance and relief. We currently cater for 85 children on a daily basis providing food, psychosocial support, school fees and gardening lessons. Our water supply in Kambuzuma have been very poor but with your assistance we have been able to buy water which keeps the centre running over and the garden flourishing.

#### Education in a time of crisis

Due to the pandemic, we have a crisis where education is concerned. This year we introduced lessons at the centre. Children are divided by grade and teachers come into the centre to provide the children with extra lessons. We have lost the majority of the academic year as schools were closed. These extra lessons provide the children with an opportunity to learn and compete with "well to do" children in the country. We have also have nurses and social workers who come in to conduct health lessons and reproductive health lessons so that our children are educated and can take care of themselves and protect themselves when they are not at the premises.
